If you would like to snatch up that last open spot, please let me know by the end of April 2025.



Moving units within the Cooperative Policy adopted April 22nd, 2025

Internal transfers involve a member(s) changing their unit within the cooperative, rather than selling their ownership outright. This process involves transferring share ownership and occupancy agreements. It's often done to accommodate changing household needs or economic situations.

When a membership (unit) becomes available for sale, the members are offered first option to move within the cooperative. Members have 5 days to view the unit and submit their written intent to purchase (transfer units) within the 5 days. Any notices received after the deadline are null and void.

After 5 days, the manager will review the letters of interest, and offer the purchase to the member who has been at MSC the longest (most seniority, date of membership certificate).

Full payment, a subscription agreement & occupancy agreement is signed within 7 days, and a new ACH payment set up for the new unit.

20% Capital Fee – this is calculated on the sales price of the new membership, less any capital fee you may have already paid towards your existing unit. i.e. if you have already paid \$5,000 as a capital fee to your current unit, and the new unit is \$7,000; you pay the difference of \$2,000.

The members will temporarily own both units and be responsible for paying the monthly fee & utility bills for each until their original unit is sold.


Moving process:

- 1. Member(s) is given the option to purchase new membership/unit.
- 2. Member(s) sign paperwork and pay the share cost for the new unit, typically within 3 days of being notified of their option to purchase.

- 3. Member(s) temporarily owns both units and pays both monthly fees until the original unit sells.
- 4. The original unit is subject to the unit turnover policy and the steps to sell that unit/share are started when the unit is ready for sale.

Selling existing units:

- 5. Member signs notice of intent to vacate.
- 6. Unit is listed in-house for 5 days.
- 7. If no one in-house takes the unit, it goes to the wait list for 10 days.
- 8. Members will pay both monthly carrying fees until the original unit sells.
- 9. When the original unit/membership sells, the proceeds will be distributed, less closing costs, within 30 days of the sale of the membership.
